# **School Context September 2021**

Roch Community Primary School is situated between Haverfordwest and St Davids in the small, rural village of Roch. The school was opened in 1973. In recent years, the school building has been extended to include two new classrooms.

Pupils who attend the school come from a large rural catchment area that is neither economically or socially disadvantaged. In September 2019 the school had 147 pupils on roll, split into 5 mixed year classes.

The present head teacher has been in post in an acting capacity since January 2014, and was appointed to the role permanently in December 2015. The deputy head took up her post in September 2016, and is currently on maternity leave.

The school was last inspected in November 2015 when both the current performance and prospects for improvement were judged as "good", the school was placed in LA monitoring solely due to benchmarked attendance data being in the lower two quartiles for the previous two years. The school was removed from LA authority monitoring in February 2017.

The school has been placed in the Yellow category every year categorisation has taken place.

Year 6 pupils either transfer to Haverfordwest High School or Ysgol Penrhyn Dewi.

The school delegated budget per pupil for 2019 -20 was £3641.

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
